



## Sports Premium Statement: 2016 – 2017

### What is the Sports Premium?

The government initially provided additional sports funding to schools in 2013, following the London Olympic Games. This is now the fourth year of the extra sports funding - Sports Pupil Premium. Fairway School is due to receive £9,038 during the academic year 2016/17. The PE Premium funding is being used to continually improve PE and Sport Provision across the school. This initiative will be led by the school's SLT and PE subject lead.

### Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sports funding on improving their provision of PE and sports but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Fairway School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.
